AEM 7852: Sustainable Environment, Energy, and Resource Economics (SEERE) Seminar

Course Description: The goal of this weekly seminar is to provide a formal and organized venue for EERE PhD students and faculty to interact and discuss research, and to learn about the frontier in the area. Some of the seminars by external speakers may be jointly held with other workshops on campus.

Presentations by PhD students may be **short** (30 minutes) to discuss early-stage ideas or **long** (60-75 minutes) for more developed projects. Short presentations should still have slides, but you can think of them more as a group discussion (i.e., feel free to have very preliminary results, ask the audience for suggestions or what they think, talk about current challenges, etc.). We will schedule multiple short presentations on the same day.

Students who plan to go on the market in environmental, energy and/or resource economics are required to do at least one long presentation per year starting their third year. Second year students are strongly encouraged to do either a long or short presentation but are not required.

All students doing long presentations must send me a draft by the Monday before the presentation and I will make it available for download on the course Canvas page. The "draft" should be at least a first cut at a full paper. Those doing short presentations may circulate relevant material (slides, short write up, etc.) before their talk, but it is not required. Participants are expected to attend all seminars, read the draft in advance of the seminar, have a list of comments and suggestions for the speaker by the beginning of the seminar, and be an active participant during the seminar. Written comments should be submitted on Canvas prior to the seminar.

What you can expect from me: Comments during your talk on the content and written comments on your paper if you are doing a long presentation.
